## School Gate Timings



Thank you for ensuring your child arrives at school on time. Being ready to start the day is so very important for each child's learning.

## Attendance Matters



This week our our whole school attendance is 96.3%.



If your child is unwell and needs to be kept at home, you must call the school to inform us each day they are absent by 9am.



If your child is late for school you must accompany them to the school office to sign them in.



Just to remind parents/carers that if they take their children out of school without authority for 5 or more days (which do not have to be consecutive), then the following will apply:

1. If you have not incurred a penalty notice relating to this child/children in a rolling 3 year period since 19 August 2024, then the penalty notice will be charged at the rate of £160.00, per parent/carer per child, if paid within 28 days. This will be reduced to £80.00 if paid within 21 days of receipt of the notice. Failure to pay the Penalty Notice will result in Surrey County Council considering legal proceedings against you in the Magistrates Court.

- 2. If you have incurred a penalty notice relating to this child/children since 19 August 2024, the rolling 3 year period will be activated from the date of the first penalty notice and the second penalty notice will be charged at the flat rate of £160.00, per parent/ carer per child, if paid within 28 days. There will be no reduction for payment within 21 days. Failure to pay the Penalty Notice will result in Surrey County Council considering legal proceedings against you in the Magistrates Court.
- 3. If you have incurred 2 penalty notices relating to this child/children in the rolling 3 year period since the first penalty notice was issued, then you will NOT receive a third penalty notice Surrey County Council will have no option but to consider a prosecution, per parent/carer per child, in the Magistrates Court under s 444 Education Act 1996.

Surrey County Council is not responsible for authorising pupil absence and therefore cannot withdraw any Penalty Notice requests without the written permission of the Headteacher.

# Thank you from Uganda

A Huge Thank You – and a Little Update from Uganda!

I just wanted to send a big thank you to everyone at the Marist School for your amazing donations to Amatsiko Preparatory School – books, school supplies, clothes... honestly, it

all made such a difference.

I've just returned from Uganda, and it was such an incredible experience. I got to meet all the children, and it was truly heart-warming. They were so excited – and so proud – to show me their classrooms. Thanks to a separate fundraiser and the support of Kelly Newton, founder of Nixi Body, I was also able to give 76 girls at the school a set of period pants so they can stay in school throughout the month. It might seem like a small thing, but it's genuinely life-changing for them. While I was out there, I also visited Buzaniro – a rural mountain village where families used to walk four hours up and down steep hills just to collect water. But thanks to the school's founders, that's changing. They've







already installed 140 rainwater harvesting tanks and filters, giving families safe, clean water right at their homes – no more exhausting treks or dirty rivers. The goal is 200 tanks, and each one costs just £185.

Alongside that, they're planting fruit trees to help families grow their own food. Each tree feeds a household, helps prevent soil erosion and mudslides, and only costs £2.20. It's incredible – such small amounts really do make a huge difference.


