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<p>statistic</p>	<p>A fact or piece of data obtained from a study of a large quantity of numerical data.</p>	<p>world population</p>	<p>There are about 7.9 billion people in the world.</p>
<p>population</p>	<p>The number of people in a particular place.</p>	<p>demographic</p>	<p>A particular sector of a population, for example: age or gender</p>
<p>resources</p>	<p>Something that a country has and can use to increase its wealth.</p>	<p>economic activity</p>	<p>People's work to earn money to support themselves.</p>

<p>area of critical concern</p>	<p>An important issue which effects the whole of the world's population.</p>
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
