He made major breakthroughs in science and maths. 508 BC: Democracy begins in Athens, giving greater power to the people. 450 BC: Athens becomes a powerful city and controls an empire. 432 BC: The Parthenon, the most famous building in Athens, is completed. 336 BC: Alexander the Great is King and helps the Greek empire expand further. 146 BC: Rome conquers Greece, making it part of the Roman Empire.
