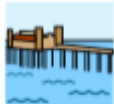
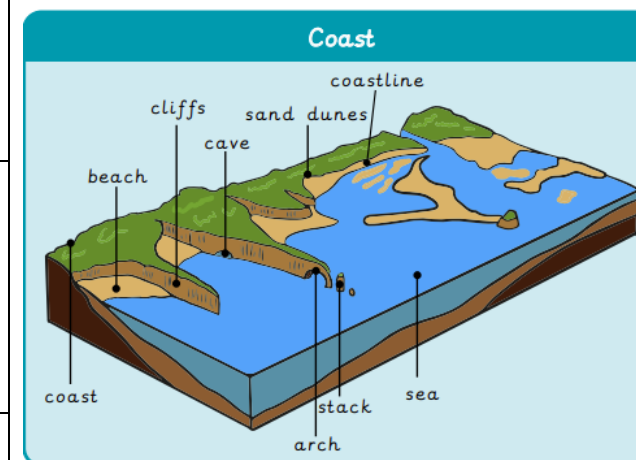

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 capital city	The main city of a country where the government works.	 aquarium	A place where sea animals are kept and looked after, often for people to visit.	 cliff	A steep rock face at the edge of the sea.
Field work	Learning outside by exploring, observing and collecting information about places.	 coastline	The edge or line where the land meets the sea.	 island	A piece of land surrounded by water.
 coast	The place where land meets the sea.	 mudflat	A flat, muddy area by the sea that is often covered by water at high tide and uncovered at low tide.	 pier	A long structure built out into the sea that people can walk along.
 harbour	A safe place by the sea where boats can stop or stay.	 tourist	A person who visits a place for fun or a holiday.	physical feature	Something made by nature, not by people (like rivers or mountains).
 sand dunes	Hills of sand formed by the wind near the beach.	 bay	A curved part of the coast where the land goes inwards.	human feature	Something made or built by people (like houses or roads)
