help us
understand who
Jesus is and how
he cares for us
and guides us.

John writes that
the purpose of his
Gospel is " for
people to believe
that Jesus is the
Messiah, the Son of
God and that by
believing you may
have life" (John
20:30-31).

The
sacraments
engage all the
senses, not just
intellect and are
earthly signs of
the presence of
God, especially
in the Eucharist.

Mary prays
and asks
Jesus for
help at
Cana.

The sacraments
are meeting
points with God
that bring people
into a closer
relationship with
God and the
community of the
Church.

The Church has seven
sacraments. The
sacraments of initiation
are baptism,
confirmation, and
Eucharist. The
sacraments of healing
are penance and
anointing of the sick. The
sacraments in service to
Holy Communion are
marriage and Holy
Orders.

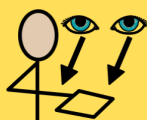
